Fleming was to clear out the enemy who were harassing "A" Coy, from the rear. The tanks were unable to cross the obstacle due to the accurate firing of the S.P. gun at MR 405426 and it was decided to smoke the gun position off while the tanks made a dash for "A" Coy, position. The Desert Air Force made a sweep over "A" Coy, positions at 1345 hrs and straffed the enemy who were forming up for another counterattack.
