1. CHURCH PARADES:- DIVINE SERVICES FOR SUNDAY 19 MAR 44.

PROTESTANT: Church Parade will be held in Bn HQ lines at 1000 hrs. Markers will report to RSM at Bn HQ at 0945 hrs. Coys will parade independently to area. DRESS: Battle Dress, Anklets, Field Service Caps.

R.C. PERSONNEL: All R C Personnel will parade to "The little church on the hills", CASALETTA for Mass at 1000 hrs. Personnel will RV at Bn HQ at 0900 hrs. Senior NCO present will be i/c parade. DRESS: Battle Dress, Anklets, Field Service Caps.

2. BLACKOUT

Blackout will be strictly enforced. NO open fires will be allowed during blackout hours.

3. CAIS - MECHANIC

Cais Mechanic will NOT be worn at any time except by drivers actually engaged in maintenance of a vehicle.

4. RUBBER BOOTS

Rubber Boots will NOT be worn unless authorized by Bn HQ.

5. PATCHES DISTINGUISHING - PERTH

Patches Distinguishing Perth will be put up by all Personnel on all uniforms forthwith.

6. DRESS

All personnel will be correctly dressed and smartly turned out whenever proceeding outside of Coy lines, except personnel going to wash vehicles, who may wear coveralls and rubber boots.

7. SECURITY - CIVILIAN LABOUR

With ref to "Rules governing the Employment of Civilian Labour in Eighth Army" forwarded with L ORC 132/44 attention is drawn to para 8 as follows:-

"When civilians are employed with S.M. or Allied Forces, it is essential that the records of all those in the undermentioned categories are investigated by the Security Authorities:-

(a) All civilians who are to be employed on work which may allow access to info of military importance, or give opportunity for sabotage;

(b) All Stevedores;

(c) All civilian contractors desirous of obtaining military contract

(d) Gangers and Chief Gangers employed in any Army, Naval or RAF est. The Gangers will then be held responsible for the bona fides of the labourers they bring in;

(e) In order to ensure that this is done, the following procedure is laid down:-

(1) Units requiring to employ civilian labour in the above-mentioned categories, viz. local interpreters, clerks, Mess Servants etc., will indent on the nearest P.O. Sec for a supply of blank Application Forms and Work Permits.

(2) One part only of the Application Form will be completed by the unit for each applicant.

(3) An official work permit will be completed for each applicant by the unit.

(4) The Work Permit will be attached to the Application Form and will be delivered to the nearest P.O. Sec for vetting.

(5) The P.O. Sec will examine each individual application and if no objection is raised to the employment of the applicant, they will insert their official stamp on the Work Permit, date and initial it, and forward it to the unit for issue to the applicant.

(6) In the interest of security, it must be so strongly stressed that this procedure must be strictly adhered to, so as to defeat enemy attempts at sabotage and espionage.

1. TRAINING

Coys going to train at the river will embuss at the parking lot in D Coy area, at the following times:

Mornings

0745 hrs

Afternoons

1245 hrs

During the half day that river training is not being done the coys will follow syllabus as laid down. Uniformity of dress will be adhered to for all training.

2. CURFEW

Curfew each night will be at 2130 hrs. By this time all personnel will be in their billets and aattoo roll call will be taken. The coy detailed to attend the last show will be granted sufficient time to allow personnel to return to their billets before roll call.

3. DISCIPLINE

It is again brought to the attention of all ranks that compliments MUST be paid at all times. Negligence will result in Disciplinary action.

4. GUARDS

Town Guard: A town guard consisting of 1 Sgt - 3 Cpls - 18 ORs will be mounted by coys in the following order:

26 Mar	- A Coy	29 Mar	- C Coy
27 Mar	- B Coy	30 Mar	- Sp Coy
28 Mar	- D Coy		

Boat Point guard: A guard consisting of 1 NCO and 4 ORs will be mounted at the Boat Point by Sp Coy each night at 1600 hrs. The guard will return the following morning after the coys have arrived for train.

Bn HQ Guard: Sp Coy will supply a guard of three men for Bn HQ each day from 0700 hrs until 1700 hrs.

5. PATCHES

Patches distinguishable from Perth are available at Bn HQ and will be put up by all personnel on all uniforms IMMEDIATELY. Divisional patches may be used on front coats by personnel who have not got three sets of Perth patches.

6. RUBBER SOLES

Rubber Soles will not be worn unless authorized by Bn HQ.

7. GARBAGE & WASTE

All garbage and refuse will be disposed of by coys in accordance with sanitation regulations. The throwing of litter on the street is forbidden and any infringement will result in severe disciplinary action.

8. WATER

The water supply is limited and must be used sparingly. All available containers for the water should be collected and kept in camp areas.

9. DRESS

All personnel will be correctly dressed and smart, turned out whenever proceeding outside of Coy barracks.

10. DAMAGE TO CROPS

All Con tps will be warned that on no account will olive trees or other orchard trees be cut or mutilated for any reason.

Such cutting will be regarded as ~~an offence~~ and will be treated as such.

11. DISCIPLINE - DRIVERS MT

Drivers of MT will NOT smoke under the following circumstances -

- (a) When in or around vans with inflammable or explosive loads being carried.
- (b) While driving, under any conditions.

12. MARKING OF WATER CONTAINERS

Instances have recently occurred of petrol in containers being put on stoves, in mistake for water, with disastrous results.

All water containers will be clearly marked with a large 'W' and NO improvised containers not so marked will be put over stoves or heating appliances without first being identified as containing NO petrol or kerosene.

13. CENSORSHIP - Breach of Green Envelope Privilege

Cases have been reported of green envelopes being handed to Italian photographers in order that films left for developing might be returned to the owner by post. The envelopes have been addressed to the owner of the films and the certificate, stating that the contents of the envelope relate to nothing but private and family matters, signed by him and the unsealed envelope handed to the photographer. This is an abuse of the green envelope and is also likely to lead to breaches of security.

Under the Censorship Regulations all ranks are forbidden:-

(a) To hand to any civilian any envelope or other cover addressed to them and capable of being transmitted by post.

(b) To write their own address to any civilian. Disciplinary action will be taken in the event of offenders.
