Passed away at the Louise Marshall Hospital, Mount Forest on Friday, May 28, 2004.

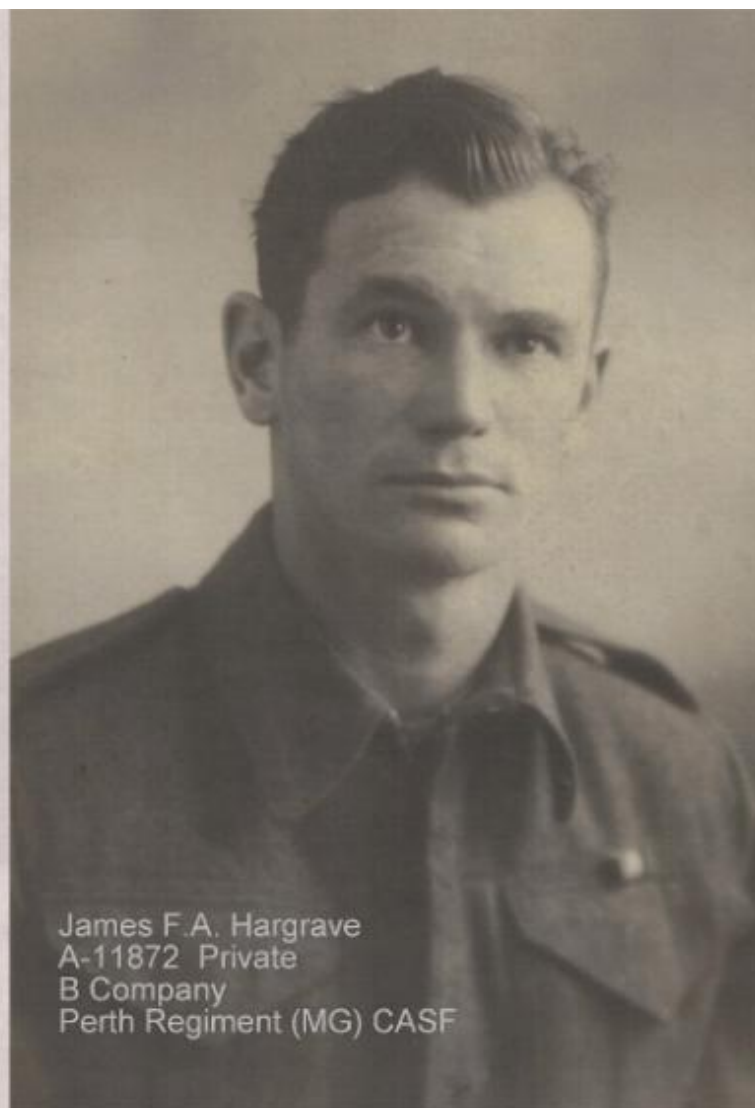
